About our trips at Downlands Community School

At Downlands, we are incredibly proud of the variety of different trips we offer our students during their time with us. These opportunities contribute to our Character Education which enable all students to build on our important ROCKS characteristics, allowing our students to find their way in the world and build qualities which we believe will help them become well-rounded learners.

The purpose of this booklet is to provide prior warning of these trips so that parents and students can prepare and plan for these. The majority of these trips are well established and have run for numerous years, however some are exciting new opportunities. Whilst we hope this list will be definitive for this academic year, we do anticipate that some additional trips may become available on an ad-hoc basis and we will try to give as much prior warning as possible.

Throughout the year, different departments will offer trips both linked directly to their curricula and to enrich and enhance our students' understanding of these subjects. To help understand the value of our trips, they have been categorised as the following:

1. **Core curriculum** - these trips are **essential** for particular GCSE courses and as a result, all students studying these courses will attend these trips. Funding will be available for PP students to attend these trips (upon request)
2. **Curriculum enhancing** - these trips are directly linked to the curriculum but are not compulsory and therefore we would expect as many students as possible to be able to attend these trips, however it is not guaranteed. These trips will be funded 50% for PP students upon request.
3. **Enrichment** - these trips are entirely for enrichment purposes. Whilst we would love for as many students as possible to attend these trips, they are not compulsory, and places may often be limited. Sometimes places may have some funding for PP students (upon request).

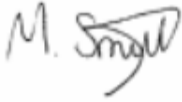
Furthermore, we offer an exciting programme of residential trips throughout the academic year. You will find more information about these trips from page 12. These trips will always be led by a reputable tour company and accompanied by experienced Downlands staff. We hope that these trips offer a wide variety of opportunities and prices. Places on these trips are always limited and often dictated by the availability of Downlands staff to volunteer attending them during their holiday time. You will find a copy of our residential applications policy on page 12.

At the end of the academic year, all students in years 7 to 9 will participate in two days of Curriculum Enrichment Activities (CEA). Further information about this year's CEA will be sent out at a later date but we anticipate another exciting programme with a variety of different trips which have been carefully chosen to interest all of our students. Brief details of the CEA are listed in this booklet.

Finally, following the successful launch of our Character Passport last year, we are pleased to provide further details on this. The goal of the scheme is to pledge that **all** students at Downlands will attend a wide range of different cultural opportunities during their time with us. These trips will take place during two designated Character Days in January and May and it is expected that these trips will be attended by all students. All Character Passport trips will be reduced by 75% for Pupil Premium students, these prices are highlighted as PP on the below list. Further information about the Character Passport will be coming shortly but for your reference, they are highlighted in green on the below list.

Throughout our wide range of trips and visits, the safety of our students remains the most important factor. Planning for these trips will always involve inspection visits, full risk assessments and appropriate training for staff accompanying trips. All of our trips will be approved by West Sussex County Council and we will work with them to ensure all important aspects of safety are adhered to. Residential Visits

Application Policy

All students will have an equal opportunity to apply for our residential trips, however if a trip is oversubscribed, we will follow the below criteria:

- Some trips will only be initially available to students studying a particular subject at GCSE. This is highlighted in the residential trips section of this booklet. Students not studying this subject will be added to the reserve list for this trip.
- All remaining students will be allocated a number and a random number generator will be used to allocate places.
- All unsuccessful students will be added to a reserve list, if a place becomes available the same random process will be used.
- For most residential trips, students from the reserve list must be replaced with the same gender

The school does not make selections based on any other criteria such as age, gender (unless a like-for-like replacement is needed from a reserve list), how many other visits the students have been on or the students' behavior record (unless there needs to be serious consideration given to the current behavior of the student and the impact this may have on the smooth running of the trip and/or Health and Safety of other students and staff).

Berlin Trip

Berlin is the centre of both history and culture. We fly over to Berlin from Gatwick and stay in a central hostel. This trip provides an opportunity for students to enhance their understanding of the GCSE course on Weimar and Nazi Germany, the Cold War and enjoy German culture. We will visit the Reichstag (German Parliament); see the Berlin Wall that divided the nation in two; discover life in East Germany at the DDR Museum and a guided tour around The Olympic Stadium.

The students will also have the opportunity to have a guided tour around the Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp to learn about the horrific reality of living under the Fascist dictatorship in Germany. Meals are all provided and there will be an opportunity for students to shop and enjoy life in Berlin.

Battlefields or Opal Coast Trip

All students in Year 9 will have the opportunity to take part in a one night residential overseas to either:

- The north Central area of France, surrounding the River Somme, saw some of the harshest fighting in the First World War and consequently has numerous memorial and cemeteries dedicated to the men and women who lost their lives. History groups studying WWI will be able to explore the actual trenches, tunnels and battlefields that were occupied by soldiers who were often not much older than themselves.
- A short hop across the channel The Opal Coast is an ideal region for first time visitors to France. Located between Calais and Boulogne-sur-Mer, in the north west of France, the Opal Coast is renowned for picture postcard settings that are rich in tradition and history. Practice French at a local market; discover how chocolates are made at a small manufacturer; learn how to bake bread at a boulangerie; meet the sea lions at Nausicaa Sea Centre.

Both trips will include ferry travel, half board meals (breakfast and dinner) and one night accommodation at a 3* hotel or hostel.

Geography Booster Course

Every year, the geography department offer a weekend residential revision trip in the Spring Term for year 11 students to be supported in their revision for their final GCSE exam. This unique opportunity will give students the opportunity to see geography 'in the field' and get a deeper understanding of many of the concepts on the exam board specification, particularly the more complex physical geography topics that many students find the most challenging to learn. The trip will be exploring the West Sussex coastline, river systems and our local urban areas, with one night stay at a YHA Hostel in Truleigh Hills near Shoreham.

This includes the one night stay at the YHA, two hot meals (dinner and breakfast), a packed lunch for the second day, transport to and from the YHA plus all revision materials.

Iceland Trip

This trip is during the start of the Easter Holidays (over the Easter bank holiday weekend). This trip will provide a wide range of opportunities for your child, whilst the itinerary is fluid, previous trips have included:-

- A swim in the geothermal waters of the Secret Lagoon
- A thrilling hike (involving crampons and ice axes!) on the Solheimajokul glacier
- Visits to two active volcanoes (Eyjafjallajokull & Hekla)
- A two hour boat trip to (hopefully) watch some of Iceland's whales!
- Observations of unique landscapes including waterfalls, craters, geysers and valleys
- Evening activities including swimming and an escape room.
- Hopefully, a chance to see the Northern Lights.

The 5 day visit will be organised by the tour operator Discover the World. The tour will be led by seven members of Downlands staff and an experienced tour guide who will remain with the party throughout each of the planned excursions

Duke of Edinburgh Award

Your child has the opportunity to take part in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme, which operates through years 10 and 11. We have run the award for over 20 years now and it represents a fantastic opportunity for young people to discover fresh interests, make new friends and provide service to others. The award is also seen, nationally, as beneficial to those moving onto further education, either at college or university.

The award is achieved by completing a personal program of activities in FOUR sections:

- Community service/Volunteering*
- Skills*
- Physical Recreation*
- Expedition

*Volunteering, Skill and Physical are done over a 3-month period, with one of those sections carried forward for a further 3 months

The vast majority of these activities take place, weekly, during the participants leisure time, with Expedition training/planning taking place over 2/3 weekends. It is therefore important that there is a genuine commitment on the part of each individual to give up the required time in order to succeed. Attendance at expedition training is compulsory. It is of crucial importance therefore that those opting for the Award Scheme do so because they personally wish to participate. Personal commitment and enthusiasm are vital, and joining the award should not be undertaken because a friend is involved, because of parental pressure or just for the camping element.

Partnership Visit to India

Downlands has had the unique opportunity of being partnered with Ellen Sharma School in Chennai, India for over 10 years. Every three years, we successfully run a trip to Chennai to further this partnership and immerse Downlands students in a completely different culture.

We will fly direct from Heathrow with British Airways. Throughout the trip to India, we will be staying at Aloft Chennai, a four star hotel. Students will spend time within the school, taking part in workshops and teaching lessons. There will also be some excursions to local temples, arts villages, a crocodile sanctuary and Chennai beach.

This trip is an incredibly valuable experience for student and in the past has inspired numerous students to return to the school in their gap year/after life. However, it is also a huge privilege to be representing the school and with this comes some responsibility. Students going on the trip are expected to engage with the school partnerships both prior to and after the trip. This can include leading assemblies, writing to students in India, writing reports for local press, filming a promotional video and visiting local primary schools in Sussex.
